Welcome to the April 2019 issue of the Jordans Village Community Newsletter!





News from the Village Store

Fresh food from sustainable sources

Everyone should care about where their food comes from and how it is packaged, so we thought we'd explain a little about three types of staple foods we stock and where they're sourced from.

Bread - baked for us on site at local bakeries in Chalfont St Giles and Little Chalfont - yes even on Sundays!

Milk - a local dairy bringing milk down from a herd in Staffordshire. An excellent price for a dairy with a direct connection with a farmer.

Vegetables - brought from the market to us via Blackwells - now under new ownership with a very enthusiastic female owner at the helm. She prides herself on locating the freshest fruit and vegetables and not covering them in plastic! Yes more expensive than supermarkets, but well worth it.

The more you buy the more is brought in and this could easily happen on a daily basis.

DON'T PASS THE SHOP BY - go in and as a result feed yourself and your families with the freshest produce available.

About the Village Store

Jordans Village Community Store, founded in 1922, is an independent community store, owned, operated and controlled by the Village. It is run by a combination of part-time staff

and volunteers from the local community.

It started in a very small way in the front room of one of the early workers' cottages by the Village Green. In 1921, the brick building, now used as the Estate Office, was erected and a proper store opened.

The store is now a general grocers, with green groceries, an off-licence, a sub post office and café. It caters for online orders, and home delivery. The Store also serves as a natural meeting place for many of those living around the village, so why not come in and receive a warm welcome from our friendly staff and team of over 60 Village Store volunteers who are all eager to help you.

Our Living Village

A Seer Green & Jordans Society Project in Partnership with the Chiltern Society

The histories of the two villages of Seer Green and Jordans are very different, yet both histories are equally fascinating – as demonstrated by the current centenary celebrations in Jordans, the local history booklets that have been produced periodically for each villager, and the rich collection of memorabilia that the Seer Green & Jordans Society has collected over the years.

But with the passing of time and the fading of memories such information can easily be lost to future generations, so the question is how can we capture and retain our village histories

in a form which is exciting, enduring and readily accessible? And how can such information be maintained and updated, since our history is not just what happened centuries ago – it's what happened yesterday, is happening today, and will happen tomorrow.

That's why we're partnering with the Chiltern Society on an exciting new initiative — we're launching a community project to pull together the diverse strands of our village histories into a comprehensive, computer-based history of the two villages. This project will allow us to combine our wonderful historical maps — such as the illustrated 1753 Godolphin map of Seer Green (above), or the 1579 Saxton Map (below) — with information on the patterns and growth of the village populations. We'll then use these as a basis for illustrating the various rich themes of village life — from religion, education and employment to our local flora and fauna, from sport and leisure activities to music, drama, literature and the arts. And really just wherever our interests and our imaginations take us — from village families, to woodlands, to wartime, to geology, topography and archaeology.

We're currently putting together a project team to computerise the village maps and population data, while at the same time inviting contributions from groups and individuals who can provide information on any of the many strands of village life mentioned above. So we're looking to involve the schools, the churches, the clubs, the pubs, and everyone else who values and cherishes our wonderful two villages.

We're also planning to incorporate information from other sources, such as the national geological maps and details of all the archaeological treasure found in this area. And right at the leading edge of technology, we've been invited to incorporate LiDAR data from the aerial survey that's currently being carried out across the Chilterns. This data will provide us with remarkable new insights into our local landscape, even allowing us to see through woodlands to see every feature hidden within them.


At the end of this two-year project we'll hand over this rich, deep history of our communities to the appropriate village organisations, to be maintained and developed as an enduring and living history of our two villages. So this project offers you a wonderful opportunity to participate in the creation of something totally unique and very special for current and future generations of Seer Green and Jordans.

We'll be launching this project in Seer Green on 30th April at the Baptist Church and **in Jordans on 1st May at the Jordans Village Hall** – both meetings starting at 8.00pm. If you'd like to know more about the project and are interested in getting involved in any way, please do join us at one of these meetings – or if you really can't wait, please feel free to contact me. It would be great to have you involved!







Paws for Thought

Always bag it and bin it, even if no one is watching!

Here in Jordans when it comes to popping out with the dog we are very lucky because we have Crutches Wood and Chalky Field as close and convenient places to walk. There is also the village green where people throw balls for their dog. However, whereas the majority of dog owners do behave in a responsible manner and pick up, it is still evident that not all dog owners are picking up. *Picking up after your dog is important and is part of responsible ownership*. There is a dog waste bin on Beech Lane opposite the gate to Chalky Field, and one on Green North Road. If you are not near to a dog bin double wrap using two bags and place in a normal litter bin.

There is no reason not to bag it and bin it. Most councils require dog owners and walkers to carry two disposable bags per dog but three per dog is advisable in my experience. (Ed: There is an emergency supply of bags on back of the Estate Office if you are caught short!) When walking a dog a constant eye should be kept on their actions so they can be kept under control. Talking on mobiles or to a friend whilst walking briskly could mean that you don't notice when your dog is making a deposit or eating something that may harm it, like part of a cow pat, which may contain harmful bacteria.

Apart from the nasty bacteria that dog poo may contain it is not pleasant to encounter it littered around the place. The two lovely black and white cows that graze in Chalky Field are not there to produce calves or milk, but it isn't very pleasant to think of them grazing in

a field that is littered with dog faeces. Cows that produce milk or still calve can contract Neosporosis through a parasite that is transmitted through dog poo and can cause them to abort. A gram of dog faeces contains 23 million faecal bacteria such as Salmonellosis and E. coli and numerable others. However, not every dog's poo contains the same type of bacteria or parasites, but it does contain more than any other type of waste.

In Crutches Wood deposits are still to be found on the paths. In addition to this walkers tend to kick leaves over their dog's poo rather than pick it up. But it is a misconception that dog poo is a natural fertilizer, it is not, and it can take up to a year to naturally breakdown leaving parasites in the soil. In addition to this some dogs have the nasty habit of eating the poo of other dogs. So the less opportunity they have to do this the better, as they run the risk of becoming ill.

Finally, it really does seem a shame that the parents of young children living in Jordans feel they can no longer take them into Chalky Field to sit in the grass or play, because there is so much dog poo everywhere. Since the field is rented out by JV to Dean Farm, whose cows graze there, one expects to encounter cow pats, but not large amounts of dog poo. So please be a responsible dog owner and pick up after your dog and respect our local environment.
