

More Village Concerts!

The concert on 21 January was a great success, with our local musicians providing a great range of enjoyable music. Benjamin Taylor and William Taylor started us off with two lively piano pieces, and we finished with a teenage string quartet playing Schubert. In between Nigel Morgan read some poetry, and Jan Davey, a composer from Great Missenden, played one of her own pieces with Esther Cavett and performed a piece specially written for the evening with nine other players! Altogether we had twelve performances, and our thanks go to the performers, to the audience, who clearly enjoyed the evening, and to everyone who helped organise the event.

Our next concert, on Friday 17 March, is also going to be very special. The English Piano Trio will be playing music by Beethoven, Haydn, and Rutland Boughton. Who, you may ask! Rutland was born in Aylesbury in 1878, was a successful composer of opera, choral and orchestral music in the early 20th century, and founded the first Glastonbury Festivals (for opera, not rock music). He had strong connections with Jordans, because of his close friend, Des Newell (whose daughter was Emma Dodd, whom many villagers will remember), and visited the village many times. After his death in 1960, his widow, Kay Boughton, came to live in Jordans, for some time living with the Newell family.

Boughton's music went out of fashion after he joined the Communist Party in the 1920s. The English Piano Trio, wanting to revive his music, has recorded his Piano Trio, and will be launching their CD at our concert. Members of the Boughton and Newell families will be joining us, and we hope that many Jordans residents will come as well. The concert starts at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

And on Friday 23 June, we have another concert, this time with Esther Cavett and Jane Faulkner playing classical music in the first half, and some lively Irish folk music in the second half. Another date for your diary!



Key facts:-

- 1. Incidence In males it is the most common cancer with 50K cases diagnosed per year in the UK. (Average 52,254 in 2016-2018).
- 2. Risks It mostly affects men aged 50 or over and the risk increases as you get older. You are two and a half times more likely to get it if your father or brother has had it. Black men have double the risk and develop it younger.
- 3. Most men with early prostate cancer don't have any symptoms. That is why it's important to know about your risk. If it is diagnosed early, before spreading, preventative treatment can be effective.
- 4. Regular PSA testing is currently recommended for all men over 50. For further information, see: https://prostatecanceruk.org/for-health-professionals/guidelines/interim-position-on-the-psa-blood-test-in-asymptomatic-men
- 5. There is a 78% survival rate (for 10 years) based on England & Wales data for 2013-2017.

Bill Turnbull's warmth as a breakfast show host woke us up each morning. His diagnosis woke up Britain to prostate cancer. And his death sparked an outpouring of love and the biggest ever spike of people checking their risk in a single day.

The much-loved BBC Breakfast broadcaster and journalist inspired millions with his warmth, humour and easy charm. And since he shared the news of his diagnosis in 2018, he pushed prostate cancer up the agenda and saved countless lives.

Now his daughter is continuing that legacy. In his memory, his daughter Flora will run the London Marathon to raise money to save men's lives. A challenge the great man himself took on, no fewer than five times.

Buckinghamshire's Local Heritage List

The first entries on to the LHL were ratified by the County Council in early January - a total of 771 sites across the county - so these are now formally adopted as 'Non-Designated Heritage Assets'. You

might have seen some local and national coverage on this.

I thought it worth sharing the status of those properties/sites that have so far been submitted for consideration from Seer Green & Jordans - see the table below. 14 out of the county wide total of 771 are ours - 2% of the county so far - so I'm pretty chuffed about that! Though I'm also disappointed about the timber shelter on Jordans Village Green and the 1934 Memorial stone in Crutches Wood - but really it needs someone in Jordans, with a better understanding of their history, to make a more convincing argument for them than I was obviously able to do.

This is a dynamic process, so hopefully there's more to come; and we can continue to submit new candidates (or furnish more info where this is considered lacking). I'm happy to do that on our behalf, if anyone is aware of properties or sites that might have been missed which fit the criteria.

As previously shared (with most of you anyway I think) the Golf Clubhouse has actually been progressed to the National Schedule II Statutory list. I have also questioned whether Rawlings Farm should be considered for Statutory listing - I've been told that there is a willingness for BCC to investigate this IF more information on its history and more photos can be provided. Given that it is still being advertised for sale with full planning consent for demolition and replacement, then I think owner support for this is unlikely! However, note that the planning consent has most likely expired (despite the advertising blurb), as there was a condition attached requiring development to start within a 3 year window (from October 2019).
