
The Jolly Quaker





From Our Living Village to the Local Heritage List

In parallel with his wonderful work on the Our Living Village project, Nigel Rothwell has been beavering away making numerous submissions on behalf of Seer Green and Jordans to the Local Heritage List being created by Bucks County Council. This is a special project to identify locally important heritage assets, which contribute positively to the local character and identity of Buckinghamshire, and which are valued by local people. These heritage assets, which may be buildings, archaeological remains, parks, gardens or public works of art, sometimes have little or no protection, and over time our special places can be lost.

By adding these heritage assets to the Local Heritage List we can ensure their local importance is recognised and taken into account in the planning process. Once on the list, these assets become known as Non-Designated Heritage Assets (NDHAs).

Nigel has been advised that as a result of the BCC budget squeeze the Local Heritage List project is about to be closed to new submissions, so please do let us know if you think there's anything we should be adding that hasn't already been flagged up.

We should reflect on the success so far, with the local list adoption of a number of buildings - all now afforded some measure of additional protection, including: the Old Vicarage; both old Baptist Chapels; Jolly Cricketers; Broom Cottage; Rawlings Farm (under development threat); amongst others. And the Beaconsfield Golf Club clubhouse is now Grade II statutory listed, which came about directly because of the LHL project. In fact, as an indication of its importance Historic England features this property in their list of 16 'remarkable places' to be newly listed in 2023 – see https://historicengland.org.uk/whats-new/news/listed-in-2023/

Paws for Thought

Facts about Water Bowls

After an absence 'Paws for Thought' returns to the Jordans Newsletter on a quarterly basis.

This month my topic is hydration in dogs and water bowls. During winter dogs do not drink as much, but this means they run the risk of becoming dehydrated. Making sure you have water available for your pooch is essential even in the winter. If you are out on a dog walk and stop off at a pub, it is sensible to offer your dog a drink. However, the water bowls that are made available at pubs are mostly unclean and contain old water. So, this month I am addressing the hygiene aspect of water bowls.

Pubs, cafes, shops, and pet shops quite often put down bowls of water outside their premises. Their intentions may be good, but the staff may not know anything about the risks to dogs who drink from unclean bowls. Water bowls can collect a slime known as a biofilm, which allows harmful bacteria to take over. Water may have been in the bowl for a few days and can harbour Giardia, Leptospirosis and Coccidia (check on-line for further information) which can cause bacterial infections in dogs. On more than one occasion I have observed blue algae in a communal drinking bowl (at Gail's in GX for example). This can cause bacterial diseases that can be fatal. Rodents carry disease in their urine and is therefore sometimes present in water bowls if they have been left out overnight.

Therefore, it is essential to wash any communal bowls that are left out overnight in the morning with hot soapy water and then rinsed thoroughly.

Indoor bowls belonging to dog owners in private household should ideally be washed every day if other dogs visit, but every two days is what's generally recommended. Food bowls should be scrubbed with a brush to remove food particles and washed after every meal.

Thankfully several dog friendly pubs and restaurants now keep clean bowls behind the counter, which can be requested for use. This means your dog is the only one using it and it will be cleaned between dogs (hopefully)! I have recently noticed dogs being offered containers of clean drinking water from behind the bar at our local The Jolly Cricketers!

However, collapsible water bowls can be purchased from Amazon for as little as £2.95 and can be filled once at a venue.

The best type of bowl to use for both water and food is a stainless steel one. This is because they are the most hygienic as they do not chip or crack, so do not harbour germs so much as plastic or ceramic bowls.

However, a note on non-spill plastic bowls. These have a disc underneath the top plate, which collects slime after a very short period, which may go unnoticed, so these are especially unhygienic. They can be washed in the dishwasher, and this will keep them safe to use. White wine vinegar can also be used to clean bowls (leave in the bowl for 15 minutes and then rinse thoroughly).


Chalky Field & Well Field

What is one night sleeping outside in the open compared to the men and women who down the road in High Wycombe do just that every night during the year?

The Churchyard of Holy Trinity, Seer Green and Jordans is in reality a soft option. When we launched the CHURCHYARD GIRLS during COVID up to 6 of us were permitted to sleep out on the 4th December 2020. We had the best time around the warming fire pit blazing away, pizza and chocolates arrived in quantity and the support of all in the villages including those emerging late from the Jolly Cricketers on their first night of opening again after the 2nd COVID lockdown restrictions, which was amazing.

On the night and through <u>our 'Just Giving' site</u> we raised thousands of pounds to help the invaluable work of <u>WYCOMBE HOMELESS CONNECTION</u>.

Providing a weekly nourishing meal, a shower and a facility to wash and dry clothes as well as sourcing much needed accommodation yes, but also attempting to prevent this dire situation ever happening in the first place is the aim of WHC a Christian charity. Engaging legal experts, negotiating with landlords and spending every day maintaining the firm belief that everyone whatever their situation deserves a roof over their heads, a place to call home.

All these acts of kindness require funds.
