



SAVE OUR GREEN BELT CAMPAIGN BY THE BEACONSFIELD SOCIETY

Drop-In evening Wednesday 6th June 6 pm – 9 pm at St. Theresa's Centre, Maxwell Road, Beaconsfield (behind Waitrose)

A massive area of green belt land between Beaconsfield and Seer Green is under the pressing threat of release by South Bucks District Council for development of between 1500 – 1700 homes, offices/industrial premises and a travellers' site. 1700 homes would mean an extra c.4,500 people with thousands more cars. Several office headquarters would mean hundreds of people travelling to and from a business park on our green belt every day. One of the prospective developers, Inland Homes, have even drawn up a vision of a huge block of multistorey flats over-looking the cricket pitch, together with 3 office blocks around Pyebush roundabout. This level of development is unsustainable.

Even Jacobs, the District Council's transport consultants, say that the planned "relief road" would not be able to cope and that peak travel time increases of 600% would result through the town; so a 10 minute journey would take an hour! Consequently, they are considering extensive engineering roadworks such as: traffic lights at Potkiln Lane/A40 junction; a filter lane from A40 to A355 south, extra lanes on approach to and around Pyebush roundabout; and a 2 lane roundabout at Ledborough Lane which would see Ledborough Lane become a

traffic hotspot. The amount of development in prospect would strangle our town and affect all those who travel through it or use its services.

The green belt land under threat is a huge area which extends almost from the Beaconsfield – Seer Green railway line to jct. 2 of the M40 and abuts Beaconsfield Golf Course in places. It includes but extends far beyond the ex MOD site at Wilton Park. Both Beaconsfield and Seer Green railway stations would be impacted by traffic and commuters. The purpose of the green belt to prevent coalescence of villages would be thwarted as both conurbations would only be separated by the golf club and the smallest of margins.

This green belt land is the most expensive of the options under consideration by the District Council and as a result the main landowners have submitted "visions" of what they would like to build on their parcels of green belt, including substantial office developments. Bucks Thames Valley LEP has even proposed that the land would be suitable for a logistics base! We see development of our green belt as resulting in gross profiteering rather than in any benefit for the community.

We are holding a "drop-in" evening on Wednesday 6th June 6 – 9pm at St. Theresa's Centre, Maxwell Road, Beaconsfield (behind Waitrose). You are all invited to come and meet our Save Our Green Belt team, ask questions and please sign our petition/mandate and donate to a fighting fund. If 1,000 people each donated £50, we would reach our target to raise a £50,000 fighting fund to engage a QC and planning experts to fight to save our green belt. This is what our green belt deserves. Jordans Taverners Cricket Club A short(ish) history

Not a lot of people know this, but... Jordans still has a cricket team.

Sadly, games are no longer played at the peaceful haven that is the Green, but the Club is very much alive and flourishing and is proud to have Jordans on its badge.

As far as history records, Jordans Village Cricket Club (JVCC) was formed shortly after the birth of the modern Village in 1919, with records going back to the 1930s. Cricket was played on the Green until 1993, only interrupted by World War II and a legal action, lodged by a disgruntled house-holder, preventing cricket being played on the Green for 12 months before a landmark court case was heard in Slough County Court in 1994. Thankfully for cricket lovers, the Club prevailed and cricket returned to the Green the following season.

The case caught the imagination of sports lovers and the media and was widely reported in the UK and internationally. The Independent described the outcome at the time as follows: "Britain's village cricketers breathed a sigh of relief yesterday when a judge ruled

that the occasional threat to neighbours from balls hit for six was not sufficient reason for stopping play." For a full version of the article, please see:

The next major milestone in the Club's history was a merger with two other clubs, Chalfont Taverners and Green Dragons in 2002, necessary because of reduced playing resources in village cricket and other amateur sports clubs in general. Jordans Taverners CC was thus formed and the Club moved to Seer Green, staying as close as possible to Jordans, but to a ground with more extensive playing and practice facilities.

In 2017 the Club moved to a dedicated cricket ground in Coleshill, where it now shares a picturesque venue with Coleshill CC, playing mostly on Sundays. The emphasis is on friendship and a team ethos, with players ranging in ability from none to quite a lot. New recruits of all ages are always welcomed, whether as supporters or players. The Club has always attracted new recruits from around the world, with Australia, India and Bangladesh proving to be particularly fruitful sources. As well as Sunday fixtures, there are occasional T20 games, played on a Friday night, practice nets at Seer Green recreation ground on a Thursday evening, various social events throughout the year and an annual dinner. The Jolly Cricketers in Seer Green is a great supporter of the Club and remains the Club's after-match retreat and principal recruitment office. For contact details, please visit our website (details below), which also has match reports, player reviews, a fixture list and other generally informative items, mixed with weak attempts at humour.

The Club's greatest achievement? Some would point to the bowling performance at Farnham Common CC, where the Jordans' attack restricted the home team to 5 runs, all out. Others may mention the court case, subsequently used by other Clubs to maintain their existence. More profoundly, there are those that prefer to think about the longevity of the Club, still thriving in difficult times for participation sport, thanks in part to the friendly, welcoming atmosphere within the Club and in no small regard to the Club's pride in its roots.

Pink Paint Protest!

Jordans Village are joining this campaign over the summer months.

Council Staff, Committee Members, and Volunteers have been armed with cans of pink chalk spray and they will aim to spray all offending dog waste pink. This highlights the problem and stops people from treading in the mess by accident and spreading it into the shops and businesses in the village.

This is not an anti-dog campaign, it is a campaign to shame the anti-social behaviour of some irresponsible dog owners who refuse to clear up their pets waste.

All responsible dog owners have their pockets stuffed with dog waste bags whenever they take their pets for a walk. We hope that the pink paint will embarrass the irresponsible dog owners into picking up their dog mess.

If you see someone allowing their dog to foul the footpaths and green spaces you can <u>report</u> the incident on the Chiltern District Council web site here.

You must clean up your dog's mess. If you fail to pick up and dispose of your dog's mess, you can be issued with a fixed penalty of £50 or if prosecuted, with a maximum court fine of £1000 and a criminal record.


