NO MOW MAY

Thank you to everyone who let a little bit of Jordans grow long over May. The Village was looking verdant and colourful - here are some of our favourite verges.



Wildlife friendly gardening is not just for May. Plantlife offer these suggestions for those who can do a bit more. There is a common misconception that after #NoMowMay you should get the lawnmower out and cut your green space down completely. This doesn't have to be the case.

There is no 'best' way to manage your lawn for wildlife after #NoMowMay, but we recommend introducing a mix of grass lengths to your green space. Why should you introduce a mix of lengths?

- Short flowering lawns are best for blooms of wildflowers, like Daisies and Bird's-foottrefoil, and provide a great food source for pollinators.
- Mini meadow areas mown a few times a year are often home to taller summer flowers like
 Oxeye Daisy and Musk Mallow

• Unmown long grasses are great for wildlife, providing homes & resources for grasshoppers, frogs, hedgehogs and more.

The Soiled Underpants Challenge

Join us for the Jordans Soiled Underpants Challenge!


What is the easiest way to tell if you have healthy, fertile soil that is good for growing plants? Bury a pair of cotton pants 5cm deep in the soil, leave them for at least 8 weeks, then dig them up and see how much is left!

Bring your soiled pants to the Flower and Produce Show on 10th September and we will hang them on the Soiled Pants Line and judge whose pants have the most holes. Remember to label them with your name, where you buried them and how long they were buried for.

About Jane and Esther:

JANE FAULKNER is a member of Jordans Quaker Meeting and a frequent visitor to friends in Jordans Village. She began her career as a member of the orchestra of English National Opera. She subsequently concentrated on chamber music and is the violinist of the English Piano Trio. With this group she has recorded, toured abroad and performed on the London concert platforms and throughout the country.

ESTHER CAVETT is a pianist and musicologist living in Jordans in a house built by her grandparents in 1928. She is a senior research fellow in Music at King's College, London, Lecturer in Music at Somerville College, Oxford, and works with Water City Music (www.watercitymusic.com), bringing music to communities which would not normally have access to live music making. She has published a book on the music of Howard Skempton and writes on music analysis and related subjects.

About Inauria:

Inauria are a newly formed trio specialising in folk song and music from the British Isles. Lewis, Ellie and Louis are all current students at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance.

ELLIE DAFT is a fiddle player who started learning violin as a folk player in her local town Morris group. After deciding to broaden her playing, Ellie is completing her studies at Trinity Laban as a classical violinist but has returned to her roots of really playing and understanding folk song and dance.

LEWIS CHINN plays whistle and guitar with the group, but is typically seen playing the tuba round London in a variety of settings. In January 2023, Lewis won Trinity Laban's Gold Medal and Audience Prize with an "exuberant" performance on tuba. However, his heart lies with traditional music, which he grew up listening to.

LOUIS SUC is a passionate saxophonist studying at Trinity Laban but began his musical journey as a vocalist in musical theatre. This group has allowed him to embrace his love for the voice and explore the folk tradition and the sheer joy of collective music making.

For the Archives...

Old Denizens

Many years ago The Old Denizen Society was set up for all the students that went to Long Dene School, which was started in Jordans in the 1930s by Joy Clark and was bought by John Guinness in 1939, before the school moved to Stoke Poges in 1940.

John Smithson was the Chairman of the Old Denizen Society in the 1980s, and obtained permission to plant an American Oak tree in memory of John Guinness in front of Seedlings across the road from Long Dene House, with a carved wooden plaque marking its significance.

The wooden plaque rotted away some years ago, so John Smithson made up a new brass plaque and together with fellow Old Denizen Julian Wormleighton installed the replacement plaque on 11th May, as pictured below.

Coronation Memories

John Smithson wrote in recently with a snippet of Jordans history relating to King Charles III coronation.

While watching the BBC1 TV program 7pm 'The Eve of the Coronation', John saw Sir David Attenborough was being interviewed and the revered broadcaster and naturalist explained that he was one of very few people able to see the Coronation of George VI and Elizabeth on television, as the technology was in its infancy and TV sets were still few and far between.

John recalled that 86 years ago, on 12th May 1937, he too was one of the few who watched that Coronation on television, here in Jordans Village, in the Wellingtons' house - #92 (on the plot map) in Copse Lane (now called Greenwood). Lindsay Wellington worked at the BBC and had a TV at his home for testing and giving reports to the BBC.
