

## The special village concert

On Friday 17 March there will be an historic concert in Jordans Village Hall. The English Piano Trio will be coming to perform piano trios (piano, violin and cello) by Haydn, Beethoven and Rutland Boughton. Rutland was born in Aylesbury in 1878, and became well known as a composer of opera,

choral and orchestral music in the early 20th century. He even founded the first Glastonbury Festivals (for opera, not rock music). He had strong connections with Jordans, because of his close friend, Des Newell (whose daughter was Emma Dodd, whom many villagers will remember), and visited the village several times. After his death in 1960, his widow, Kay Boughton, came to live in Jordans.

The English Piano Trio is reviving his music, and will be launching their CD of his piano trio at our concert. We will be joined by members of the Boughton and Newell families, who will share their memories of Rutland. Some CDs of his music will be available for sale at the concert.

The concert starts at 7.30pm in the Village Hall, and we hope that many residents will be able to join us. Admission is free, refreshments will be provided, and we will welcome donations towards the cost of the concert. Seats can be booked online at:







YOUR LOCAL PROSTATE CANCER BRIEFING IN JORDANS VILLAGE HALL ON

FRIDAY MARCH 24th at 18:00

Organised by the Chilterns Prostate Cancer Support Group to raise awareness with a presentation by Joe Kearney, Advanced Nurse Practitioner at Buckinghamshire Healthcare Trust

Key facts:-

1. Incidence – In males it is the most common cancer with 50K cases diagnosed per year in the UK. (Average 52,254 in 2016-2018).

Risks - It mostly affects men aged 50 or over and the risk increases as you get older. You are two and a half times more likely to get it if your father or brother has had it. Black men have double the risk and develop it younger.

3. Most men with early prostate cancer don't have any symptoms. That is why it's important to know about your risk. If it is diagnosed early, before spreading, preventative treatment can be effective.

Regular PSA testing is currently recommended for all men over 50. 5. There is a 78% survival rate (for 10 years) based on England & Wales data for 2013-2017.



## Paws for Thought The Welfare of Dogs

As a nation of dog lovers, dogs are now being protected more than ever before. On April 1st, 2020, the former District Councils of Chiltern, Aylesbury Vale, South Bucks and Wycombe along with Buckinghamshire County Council came together to form a single Unitary Authority. This influenced the kind of vetting that dog boarding and day care establishments required. Now there are only four licensing officers to cover these areas. Recently I was visited by a member of the licensing team as my licence had expired. This inspection took place roughly 3 months after I had submitted my application form and paid the fee of £581. They will not visit you until this fee is paid.

Now licensors insist on the applicant providing a detailed plan of the premises, their insurance policy, operating procedures, fire risk assessment, emergency plan, preventive health plan, qualifications and training records and booking forms. Everything must be covered in an extensive regime and procedures list submitted to the licensing team. These must include feeding and exercise regimes as well as cleaning procedures. A first aid kit, a fire extinguisher, and a fire blanket must be kept on the premises. Any outdoor space must be dog safe. Emergency key holders must be in place.

Licences are issued for 1 to 3 years depending on the star rating awarded, which could be from 1 to 5. The higher the star rating the greater the period covered. Therefore if 5 stars are awarded the fee will cover three years. I was given a two-week period to compose a more detailed list of my procedures and regimes before my licence was granted. On completion I was awarded 5 stars and am obliged to display my licence in a public facing area of my premises.

If records and procedures are not kept, boarding and day care establishments can be closed or suspended. The officer that visited me told me that he had recently closed a cattery because they had no paperwork. However, dog walkers are not yet required to be licenced, and are not restricted by the numbers of dogs they walk unless they live in certain boroughs. For example, Lambeth Council require professional dog walkers to be licensed and follow a code of conduct when using their parks. Not long ago the press reported the death of a dog walker who was set upon by dogs in a group of 8 that she was walking. But if this dog walker had been licensed and was restricted on the number of dogs walked at one time, this tragedy might have been avoided.

Recently I watched Chloe Fuller the newly appointed pet expert on Steph's Packed lunch (Channel 4) giving advice on what lead to use. She explained that extendable, or flexi leads, were hazardous and should be avoided at all costs. It transpires that any good dog trainer will never recommend using a retractable lead. This is because if the cord is grabbed it can cause burns, deep cuts or fractures. They can also get wrapped around a person or a dog. In some cases, amputations of damaged limbs have been reported.
