The Malcolm Sparkes Collection

Recently the Estate Office was loaned a collection of Malcom Sparkes writings, given by his grandson, Julian Sparkes.

Malcolm and Leila Sparkes were not only prominent Quakers who played an important role in re-opening the Jordans Meeting House for worship in 1910 after over one hundred years of disuse, but Malcolm was also a member of the very first recorded meeting of the Committee of Management on 9 March 1916 which considered building a village that eventually became Jordans. Readers may remember that there was an article in the October 2017 issue of this newsletter about the Leila Sparkes Collection: three amazing scrapbooks of Jordans History on long-term loan from the Jordans Meeting House. Now there is the Malcolm Sparkes Collection which the Sparkes family has loaned to the Estate Office archive.

The Malcolm Sparkes Collection includes the following:


- -Leila's account of Malcolm's internment from 1917 to 1919 because of his stand as a conscientious objector;
- -Malcolm's letters from jail;
- -Malcolm's book Modern Industry The Christian Line of Development;
- -debates in the House of Commons about the treatment of conscientious objectors;
- -a scrapbook of Malcolm's watercolours of landscapes on Bude and Tintagel;
- -The Book of the Sparkes Family, compiled by Elizabeth (Leila) Sparkes, vols. 1 & 2;
- -the Funny Works Book containing Malcolm's cartoons of various ingenious and improbable designs of things such as dental machinery for filling and removing teeth and inserting false teeth, possibly inspired by Heath Robinson who was popular before, during and after WWI. (see below)


Leila Sparkes entitled her account of Malcolm's life Malcolm Sparkes 1881-1933 Constructive Pacifist; she very much stressed his constructive activity while in prison: "I should like to show our children how their father was led on from his war time activity in prison and elsewhere to work out in practice the theory of the National Guildsmen, and finally the conclusion to which his experiences forced him." Prior to his imprisonment, Malcolm, the owner of a building firm, was a key figure in developing schemes for industrial democracy, especially the National Guilds in the building industry. He was very involved in the development of Whitley Councils even while he was in prison. In fact, there were attempts to release him to carry on this important national work, but he resisted any release from prison on medical grounds and he did not want 'jam pot justice that singled him out from other prisoners and also refused to have anything to do with the war effort. He was a 'reluctant absolutist' in the words of Bert den Boggende. (" Reluctant Absolutist: Malcolm Sparkes' Conscientious Objections to World War I'' Quaker Studies Volume 10 Issue 1 Article 5).

Jordans Tennis Club Supper Evening


Location: Jordans Village Hall Date: Saturday November 13th Time: 19:00 - 24:00 hrs

My father, Nowell Stebbing, was a resident of Jordans until he passed away last December. During his last years he was writing a book, combining his great professional expertise in genetic science and his personal passion for birds and bird watching. He left behind a well-edited first draft and lots of manuscripts and notes for the final version, which I am proud to say have been lovingly combined and manipulated into the magnificent printed book, available now. Evolution is a tour-de-force by a man who was absolutely a master of his subject. It allows the reader to understand the process and causes of Evolution, from the basic science of genetics and generation, and uses the magnificent variance of bird life to exemplify the process. At nearly 450 pages its is not for the faint hearted, but for the interested reader I promise that it will be thoroughly rewarding.


Programme for November 2021 Jordans Picture House offers THREE films in November

On Friday November 12th we shall be screening "Empire of the Sun." Doors open at 7:15 p.m. and the Programme starts at 8:00 p.m. This classic film directed by Stephen Spielberg from the novel by J.G. Ballard with the screen play by Tom Stoppard was released in 1987 and was nominated for 6 Oscars with 13 wins and 17 nominations total. It focuses on a different theatre of war to that which is normally shown at this time of year.


On Sunday November 14th we shall be screening "For Sama." Doors open at 3:15 p.m. and the Programme starts at 4:00 p.m. As it is a foreign language film (Arabic) with subtitles the capacity will be limited to just 30. This film is a documentary set in Aleppo, Syria and follows the experiences of a young mother and her daughter through 5 years of the uprising in Syria. This film is the first feature documentary by Waad al-Kateab and Edward Watts. It was nominated for an Oscar and has had 71 wins and 50 nominations. It is an extraordinary film and like "Empire of the Sun" focuses on a different angle while we remember our own experiences as a nation through two World Wars.

FOR SAMA is both an intimate and epic journey into the female experience of war.



On Tuesday November 23rd we shall be screening "Little Women." Doors open at 7:15 p.m. and the Programme starts at 8:00 p.m. This film released in 2019 won an Oscar and had 28 wins and 225 nominations total. A quote from the film which still echoes today for many single women: "I'm just a woman. And as a woman I have no way to make money, not enough to earn a living and support my family. Even if I had my own money, which I don't, it would belong to my husband the minute we were married. If we had children they would belong to him, not me. They would be his property. So don't sit there and tell me that marriage isn't an

economic proposition, because it is. It may not be for you but it most certainly is for me."

Jo March reflects back and forth on her life, telling the beloved story of the March sisters four young women, each determined to live life on her own terms.

Village Security

After reporting on problems with theft in the Village in the last newsletter, we are sad to report break-ins to JVL's row of garages in October.

As a community we should be a little more vigilant, not only with our own security but in spotting suspicious behaviour. Anne Smith has set up a village WhatsApp group where we can inform each other on Village security matters. If you are not already a member then contact Anne on 07768 707241 and she will add you to the group.

If someone is the victim of theft, please inform the police. Whilst initially we may not get a great deal of support from them, if they see that this area has a problem with crime then they will have to do something about it.

Not many crimes are carefully planned. Most are opportunist and committed on the spur of the moment. This can be possessions left on display in a car, doorway, or a window to a house left open. You can reduce this risk by locking your car, not leaving house doors unlocked or windows open when you go out, even for a few minutes.

Let's keep our community safe and secure.



Village Directory 2022 Paid Temporary Job for JVL

We are looking for someone to help us with the village directory. This booklet contains contact details on every village household, in addition to other useful information. It is a valuable community asset and there hasn't been one since 2016.

Due to GDPR rules we need to ask the permission of all residents to be included in the directory. The job involves contacting every village household and getting their written consent that they are happy to be in the directory, whilst also compiling a list of contact details. You will need good email and spreadsheet skills. You may also have to follow up by phone or visit some properties.

We see this as being carried out part time over a couple of weeks. The fee for the project would be £400.

Stress Free Dog Walking

Getting out for a walk and being in the fresh air, is one of the great benefits of dog ownership. Dogs will want their walks whatever the weather. In addition to this, since the pandemic, going for a walk is one of the activities that mental health experts state as being beneficial for one's mental health.

However, walking the dog doesn't come without its hazards. With so many reports of dogs being attacked on commons or places where a lot of people walk their dogs, it can be a stressful business. When one sees a breed of dog known for being aggressive, off the lead and heading towards one, it's hard to know what the outcome might be, or how responsible

the owner is.

If you are nervous about walking your dog in certain locations, there are now walking fields available where you can walk your dog in complete safety. Local to Jordans there is the Terrific Bark Park in Stoke Poges. One can book their 1.8-acre field soley for your own use, or with a friend, thus sharing the fee (£15 an hour). There is dog agility equipment on site along with a shelter. Entry is timed so that no overlap can occur. Conversely if you have a dog that is unpredictable around other dogs, you can walk it off the lead without the fear of it getting into any trouble.
