

<u>Jordans Village Performs</u>

When I was first introduced to Jordans in 1969 it was a delight to discover a village with music making at its core. Many talented families lived on the estate and organised, performed or conducted recitals, concerts, Christmas carols, Supper and Song and other musical activities. Names such as Nash, Padday, Dodd, Roseveare, Cavett, Morley, Penney, Bradnock spring to mind — others may recall more.

Music in Jordans has had its ebbs and flows through the years but the strong threads have held, and the traditional concept of "Jordans Village Performs" has been wonderfully resurrected by Esther Cavett and a group of supporters both in Jordans and Seer Green.

The first concert in this year's series, in the Village Hall on Saturday 30th September, was a delight. Esther (piano) on the new Yamaha kindly funded by a legacy from Mel Nash, and her friend Barbara Brown (flute) treated us to a fascinating and uplifting programme which included solo works each for piano (Scarlatti and Messaien) and flute (Debussy and Roussell) as well as duets for both by Bach, Poulenc, Messaien, Druce and Faure. The audience was entranced not only by the professionalism of Esther and Barbara but also by the contrast between the vigour and excitement of some pieces and the ethereal quality of others. Esther is well known as a Jordans resident. She teaches at Oxford University and plays piano in a variety of community settings, including an outreach project in London. This concert was a repeat of one she presented with Barbara in Jordans nearly forty years ago in the presence of her grandparents Jim and Eileen Cavett.

Barbara comes from Aberdeen but now lives in Poole and is currently Professor of flute at Southampton University. She was in the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra for nine years, and has played with all the major London orchestras and with Welsh National Opera, and gives regular recitals for BSO ArtReach.

Esther comments "We want these events to be accessible to everyone but also to acknowledge the

skills and dedication of the musicians who visit us by paying them something and to cover their expenses. There are also ongoing running costs. We are asking a minimum of £8 per head for attendance. If you cannot manage this please do still come along and contribute what you can. Donations can also be made at the door by card or cash. Complimentary interval drinks will be available."

We are indeed very blessed to have the opportunity to experience wonderful music in our own village hall. Further programme and dates are listed in the Village Newsletter. The next concert will be on Saturday 20th January 2024 and is the annual opportunity for local amateur musicians of all ages to perform music they enjoy.

Our Living Village-County Recognition and Award

Well, we did it! Against fierce competition from many of the largest and longest established societies in Buckinghamshire, the Seer Green & Jordans Society in partnership with the Chiltern Society has been awarded the Bucks Archaeological Society's 2023 Prize for the "Our Living Village" project. In announcing the award winner, Sandy Kidd of Historic England praised our project as a wonderful example of community engagement and ambition, showing the way forward for innovative local history research into the twenty-first century.

The award was presented by the well-known local historian and author Julian Hunt, and accepted by Alan Kell on behalf of the two villages and the whole project team. Very appropriately, the award comprised a beautiful trophy hand-turned from "green" wild cherry wood as well as a certificate and a substantial cheque.

"I'm enormously proud to accept this amazing recognition and award from the Bucks Archaeological Society," said Alan. "It's been an amazing journey with so many people from our two villages contributing to its success. But we're not yet finished as we've still got a number of important village themes to complete and upload to the Our Living Village website. And of course, village history never stops so we continue to seek the active involvement and support of our two wonderful communities".

Earl Howe, the Patron of the Chiltern Society, has previously acknowledged the project's achievements as follows: "May I just say, having worked my way through the Our Living Village website, that I think it is a triumph".

OUR PROGRAMME CONTINUES ON NOVEMBER 10th



Last year Jordans Picture House, with generous support from you all, managed to donate £600. This year – with your help – we aim to donate **significantly** more.



Wreath Making Workshop


