



Our Living Village - Recent Developments

The current outputs from this community-led project can be viewed

at <u>www.ourlivingvillage.org</u>. The website is attracting a high level of activity and very positive feedback, including the following recent comments:

From the Patron of the Chiltern Society, Earl Howe of Penn House: "May I just say, having worked my way through the Our Living Village website, that I think it is a triumph - absolutely excellent in every way."

From one of the participants in last weekend's historical tour of Seer Green and Jordans: "Thank you so much for your excellent guided tour, I relished every moment of it and found the 'living history' approach a revelation. The website is a treasure trove of captivating information and very absorbing, even for someone who doesn't live there."

This is still very much an ongoing project, and three important new themes have recently been uploaded to the website:

1. Origins

This theme is a wonderful map-based narrative on the origins of Seer Green and Jordans, bringing together geology, topography, archaeology and history-based perspectives from antiquarian and historical maps. These maps are used to illustrate vividly the shaping of our landscape and the development of our communities over time, using twenty contemporary maps which have been sourced, digitised and combined as part of the Our Living Village project.

2. The Manor of Seer Green - Tales of Lords, Ladies and Liberties

This theme is based upon a magnificent piece of original research by Nigel Rothwell into the evidence for the medieval manor of Seer Green. For most of its existence, Seer Green was a small satellite hamlet of the important manor of Farnham Royal, and this research illustrates how its various Lords, Ladies and Tenants-in-Chief played significant roles in forging British national identity.

3. Our Village Pubs - A study of the history of Public Houses in Seer Green and Jordans

The development of pubs in our villages provides strong insights into the changing lives of their inhabitants. While the Quaker village of Jordans had, until recently, very limited activity in this area, Seer Green undoubtedly has an extensive and very colourful history.

Summer Concert at Jordans Meeting House

On the afternoon of Sunday 4th September some forty people were treated to an inspiring combination of readings and music in a Summer Concert held in Jordans Meeting House. The concert was entitled 'A Concert of Music and Words on the themes of Reflection, Renewal and Reconciliation' and included music by Beethoven, Corelli, Marianna Martinez, Mozart and Handel. The readings were mainly of poems by 20th and 21st century poets: T.S. Eliot, Philip Larkin, Langston Hughes, Alberto Rios, Bridgett Devoue, Alex Elle, Nikki Giovanni, Kai Carlson-Wee and Joy Harjo; but also Henry Wadsworth Longfellow from the 19th century. There were quotations from *Advices and Queries*. The full text of the concert programme can be accessed at the Jordans Quaker Centre website (www.jordansquakercentre.org).

The performers were Jane Faulkner, violinist, a member of Jordans Meeting, and Esther Cavett, pianist, who has known Jordans all her life and whose grandparents Jim and Eileen Cavett, and her father John Cavett are buried in the Jordans Burial Ground. Readers were Bob Hall, a longstanding attender at Jordans meeting and Nina Liebenberg, the Jordans Quaker Centre Manager.

Esther thanked Jordans Meeting for acquiring a new electric piano with good tonal qualities. She was also responsible for compiling the readings.

The Meeting House has held music and words events roughly twice a year since 2016. However, it

was not possible to hold a concert during COVID and this concert resumed the series for the first time since 2019, and it is anticipated that further events will follow. The concert was widely advertised, and the audience comprised a broad range of people including Jordans residents and local Quakers.

Each concert sponsors a charitable cause. The cause for this concert was *Escaping Victimhood*, which helps people who have had a relative or near friend murdered. Tim Newell, the founder and former Prison Governor, was present at the concert and urged people to contribute. £340 was raised for the charity.

Jane and Esther are also performing for and with school students at Jordans First School once a term and they visit Sarratt C of E Primary School on 30th September as part of the outreach work of the Sarratt Festival of Music. The contributions to the Jordans musical scene by Esther and Jane are very much appreciated.



Help for Households with Energy Bills

Millions of households across Great Britain will receive non-repayable discounts on their energy bills this winter, as the UK government today (29 July 2022) sets out further details of the Energy Bills Support Scheme.

The £400 discount, administered by energy suppliers, will be paid to consumers over 6 months with payments starting from October 2022, to ensure households receive financial support throughout the winter months.

Those with a domestic electricity meter point paying for their energy via standard credit, payment card and direct debit will receive an automatic deduction to their bills over the 6 month period – totalling £400.

Traditional prepayment meter customers will be provided with Energy Bill discount vouchers from the first week of each month, issued via SMS text, email or post, using the customer's registered contact details. These customers will need to take action to redeem these at their usual top-up point, such as their nearest local PayPoint or Post Office branch.


In all cases, no household should be asked for bank details at any point. Ministers are urging consumers to stay alert of potential scams and report these to the relevant authorities where they are suspected.
