Jordans Cricket Match

Cricket had been played regularly on Jordans Village Green for well over 70 years until David Lacey obtained a temporary injunction to stop it from being played 30 years ago this year. Ironically, only 5 years earlier Mr Lacey had bought the house named after the cricketing term "Gully End", and located at deep square leg on Green East Road.

Despite cycling over from Seer Green as a boy to watch the cricket, Mr Lacey had complained that the balls came into his garden, claiming nuisance and potential harm. He demanded that the club erect two twenty-five foot nets in front of his house or stop playing on the Green; the club refused on the grounds that this was unreasonable, too expensive and unnecessary.

Thanks to the fierce and determined opposition of a few, this dispute hit the <u>national - and indeed international - headlines</u>; the matter was discussed in the Times ("the nation waits with bated breath", observed an editorial); reported in the Daily Telegraph complete with an appropriate Matt cartoon; also by the Daily Express, the Daily Mail via Roy Hattersley, the Independent, and Today newspapers. An appeal against the injunction ended up being heard in court at Slough in May 1994.

Bewigged barristers battled balefully - or bail fully - before the Bench, His Honour Judge Hague QC. Would our white-flannelled fellows be caught out? Witnesses came and went to face verbal bouncers, googlies, yorkers, and off-breaks from learned counsel, Judge Hague umpired, and at the close of proceedings the nation awaited.

A week later the news broke in a <u>forty-six page written judgement</u> that the Laceys' claim was dismissed with costs, the injunction extinguished, and therefore cricket could continue on the Village Green. On 29th August 1994 the summer game recommenced to a sizeable crowd, much cheer and joy in most quarters of the village, followed by a celebratory barbeque on the Green afterwards.

A print of the watercolour of "The Last Match" (which of course happily it wasn't) by the late Betty Stephens is currently on display in the Estate Office. A few years later Jordans Cricket Club moved to a larger pitch in Seer Green, with its pavilion facilities and larger boundaries.

On Friday 22nd August 2014 my predecessor, Colin Brown, resurrected the match with his Estate Office XI playing Jordans Village XI - using a soft version of a cricket ball - which has become an annual tradition.

This year, the match was closely fought and resulted in the Jordans Village team taking the honours, having reached a winning score of 65 for 7 wickets after 17 overs, bettering the Estate Office team's 64 for 8 after 18 overs. It was a really enjoyable event and what made this match so enjoyable was seeing so many of the talented younger players taking part. They certainly made up for my shortcomings!

The winning team's captain, Mark Pembroke, was awarded the Ted & Hubert Cup, in honour of Ted Salisbury and Hubert Douglass - two of Jordans' most revered players of the past. The

Colin Brown Cup, named after former JVL Secretary & Estate Manager for Player of the Match was awarded to Bertie Montagu for his excellent all-round performance, and near hat-trick of wickets. The Willum Lomas Trophy for "Catch of the Match" was awarded to Horatio Holloway.

My thanks go to Jeff Holdsworth (Umpire), John Scriven (Scores), and Amanda Myers who opened the shop on a Sunday for refreshments. A special thanks go to Chris Waymouth, who took lots of photos of the match and edited them together into an amazing video which you can watch by clicking the image below. Finally, thanks to Nigel Morgan whose excellent summary of the historic 1993/1994 court battle I have shamelessly plundered for this article!

Manor Farm Field Biodiversity Project

Rain, sunshine and cake!

Thank you to the super effort of seventeen volunteers who joined the Jordans Biodiversity

Group for an hour or three on Saturday 12th August for our inaugural work event on Manor Farm Field. We managed to clear two areas approximately 5m x 5m in which we will sow wildflower seeds, put in fourteen new fence posts to shore up the west fence so that it is stock proof (the cows are now back in!) and fill two rubble bags of thistles! Thank you also to the <u>Chiltern Rangers</u> who kindly lent us the tools for the job!

We've had some great feedback. Volunteers said they enjoyed the physical exercise outside in a natural space, that it was great being part of community effort to benefit biodiversity, that it felt "wholesome" and like a "natural gym"! It was also wonderful to see people of all ages - from teens to retirees - supporting each other and having a good old chat!

Our next event will be on Saturday 4th November between 10am and 1pm. Our task will be to create two more seed beds (we want to have 4 in total in various aspects of the field), sow the wildflower seeds, and if the weather remains mild, no doubt there will be some more injurious plants to pull. There will be a mix of heavy work and light tasks so something for everyone:-) Again, you are welcome to stay as long or as little as you can. It's helpful to know in advance how many people to expect so please let us know if you can make it.





Tree Surgery Around The Green

Every 2 years, JVL surveys the large trees around the Estate for health and safety reasons, and earlier this year Simon Hawkins of Merewood Arboricultural Consultancy Services carried out such a survey for us and detailed his findings in a report.

Trees in a <u>conservation area</u> that are not protected by a <u>Tree Preservation Order</u> are protected by the provisions in <u>section 211 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990</u>. These provisions require people to notify the local planning authority, using a '<u>section 211 notice</u>', 6 weeks before carrying out certain work on such trees, <u>unless an exception applies</u>. The work may go ahead before the end of the 6 week period if the local planning authority gives consent. This notice period gives the authority an opportunity to consider whether to <u>make an Order on the tree</u>.

Buckinghamshire Council has now confirmed that we may go ahead with the surgery that is recommended to various trees within the Conservation Area, and that no Orders are being imposed. The work will take place over the next 3-6 months and mainly consists of pruning and removing dead wood, but there is one small Plum tree on the Green which is in poor condition and must be felled on safety grounds, and will be replaced with a new specimen.
